Its early years were encouraging, but it never reached its potential due to Vietnamese politics and American lack of clarity on its purpose and function.

The SF camp at Nam Dong was 30 miles west of Da Nang, on a plateau situated near the border between Thua Thien and Quang Nam provinces. The Americans and some Nung mercenaries manned the inner bastion, while the outer camp was the domain of a contingent of 312 ARVN troops. The jungle encircling the base was an ideal staging area for a guerrilla attack.
